Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your support and understanding during what has been a very warm and challenging week. We tried to find a sensible middle ground with our hot weather arrangements and recognise that we can't always please everyone. Next week we have some important events coming up. On **Monday**, we have Year 4 and Year 6 Sports Day, and on **Wednesday** it is the turn of Years 3 and 5. At this point, the weather forecast looks favourable, but if anything changes and we need to postpone Sports Day, we will contact you by **8.00am on the morning of the event**.

On **Monday**, children will be informed of their class teacher for September.
